<p>On July 4, 1910 the International Society of Photogrammetry, now the International Society of Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing (ISPRS) was founded in Vienna on initiative of Prof. Eduard Dolezal. The ISPRS is a non-governmental organization devoted to the development of international cooperation for the advancement of photogrammetry, remote sensing and their applications. The Society operates without any discrimination of race, religion, nationality, or political philosophy.</p> <p>The Society's scientific interests include photogrammetry, remote sensing, spatial information and related disciplines, as well as applications in cartography, geodesy, surveying, natural, Earth and engineering sciences, and environmental monitoring and protection.</p> <p>The Society's centenary will be celebrated on July 4, 2010 at its origin, the Vienna University of Technology. The festivities include an extraordinary General Assembly, an Afternoon Celebration, and a Gala Dinner.
