What motivates them to participate?

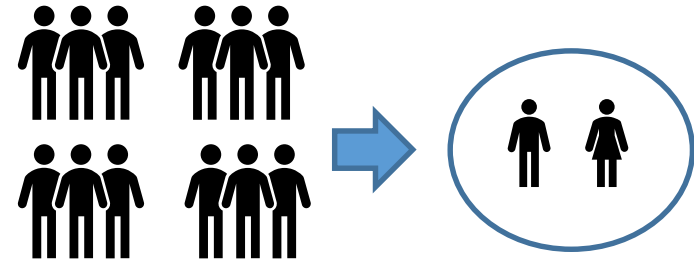
## Investigation of 9 technical committee's at the Swedish Standards Institute, SIS.

- Framework for geographic information
- Road and railroad information
- Water systems
- Addresses
- Building information
- Forestry information
- Metadata
- Physical planning
- Webb cartography



Focus on **individual** participants, not public or private stakeholders

- Participating organizations are positive
- Different meaningful goals for individual participation
- Ethical aspects in focus for some participants
- Cooperation with other stakeholders is important
- No personal career motives found, i.e. new position or increased salary
- Some individuals tend to (have to) prioritize other work which increased their workload, some work on their free time
- Cooperation with other stakeholders is important since interactions with them make the project team members aware of their needs
- Satisfying others' needs is essential for motivation according to previous research
