Founded on 18 July 1878 at Paris by surveyors from Belgium, France, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Switzerland and Spain

XI Congress in Rome in 1965

- Divided into 3 Groups (A, B and C)
- Commission 10 was added in 1998
