What are the top five challenges influencing CCD

Human Resources

- i. Number and Visibility of land professionals
- Few Land Professionals 0.9 persons in every 100,000
- Poor outreach, and engagement with policy makers and government
- ii. Diversity divides and enclaves
- Francophone vs Anglophone vs Spanish vs Arabic
- Sub Saharan Africa vs North African Region
- Internal Member association as silos
- Intergenerational gaps X vs Y

iii. Inclusivity –

- 50 percent of the population are women, but they constitute less than 1 percent in the profession
- 2. Weak Institutions
- i. Governance ii. Regulatory checks and Controls
- 3. Outdated Laws and incoherent land policies
- 4. Poor SDI Infrastructure
- i. Technical ii. Institutional iii. Funding
- 5. Poor awareness, lack of coordination and communication strategies
